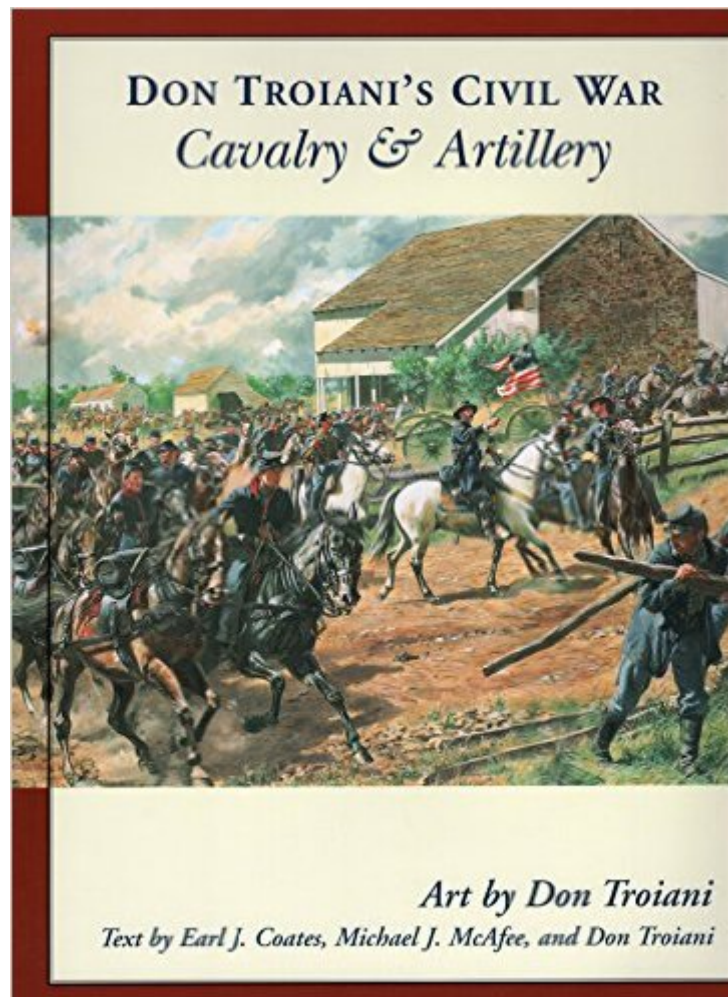

The artwork in this volume gives a flavor of how these specialized troops were outfitted.
