

I bought both 100 Words Kids Need To Read books by 1st grade and By 2nd Grade for my then 5 year old son. We did 1-3 pages before going to bed on some nights (on others I read to him). I got this for a struggling student...the spaces are too small to write in and the reading level is higher

than the grade...for example 100 words to read by third grade is written at a third grade level. If this is practice to get ready for 3rd grade it should written at a mid to end second grade...not mid third grade.

My 1st grader knew most of these words. I guess it's ok practice for kids that may be lagging behind or for Kindergarteners wanting to advance.
